We recognize that our commitment to these principles may require special protections, and we have developed the following policy to ensure that our School remains a safe and welcoming place for all students, faculty, and staff.

A. Non-Discrimination Policy:

St. Sava's Serbian Orthodox School of Theology is committed to providing an educational environment that is free from discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age, disability, veteran status, or any other characteristic protected by applicable law. This commitment extends to all aspects of the School's operations, including admission, employment, and participation in educational programs and activities.

B. Religious Protections:

D. Complaints and Reporting:
